ASH -White ash -Red/green ash -Black ash	Branches and leaves grow in an opposite pattern. Leaves are typically 5 to 15 cm long and compound with 5 to 11 leaflets. Leaflets have either smooth or toothed margins. Young trees have smooth, light gray bark. Older trees have furrowed bark with a diamond shaped ridge pattern	
ALDER	Alder trees have green bark that becomes brown with age, and have dark green leaves that are shiny on top and dull underneath. They are oval in outline with a toothed margin.	
POPLAR -Silver -Gray -Black	The leaves are alternate and ovate or heart-shaped in outline, with finely to coarsely toothed margins
